Policy on Pets and Service Animals

The ASMH prohibits pets in any meeting spaces, with the exception of service animals providing Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) reasonable accommodations for a person with disabilities. Pre-Conference Workshop Descriptions

Yoga

Calling all sore bodies! Beginner Cryostat

Those new to Mohs histotechnology will receive direct guidance and advice from experienced workshop leaders on cryostat use in the Mohs lab, and time will be given to practice cutting techniques. Also offered on Friday, May 3 from 3:30-5:00 pm.

IHC Phase II: The Technique of Immunohistochemistry

This is an interactive, hands-on workshop designed to acquaint participants with how to stain Mohs frozen sections for immunohistochemistry. Emphasis will be on the critical moments of the staining procedure, demonstration of methods, and common problems that occur. All materials will be provided and this will be a safe, hazard-free workshop. Questions are highly encouraged. Also offered on Saturday, May 4 from 7:00-8:30 am.

Intermediate Cryostat

Experienced techs will learn numerous cryostat embedding methods, as well as troubleshooting and cryostat maintenance.

Implementing Procedure and Document Control in the Mohs Lab

Procedure and documentation is critical in running your lab to maintain a safe environment and to assure quality patient care. The first step in preparing for a regulatory inspection is having the necessary laboratory policies and procedures in place. We will cover a methodical approach to creating and implementing policies and procedures in the Mohs lab. Participants will learn how to build a manual to entail technical procedures, Quality Assurance (QA), Quality Management (QM), alternate proficiency assessment, competency assessment, and safety guidelines. We will also discuss electronic document control such as MediaLab and the CLIA/CAP application process. Bring your procedure manual questions with you to this workshop.

Tipping Your Cap for CAP: Tips on How to Make Inspections Go Smoothly

This workshop will cover how to prepare for inspections, understand the difference between CAP and CLIA and how they work together while developing a structured format to ensure success. Bring your procedure manual questions with you to this workshop.

IHC Phase III: Immunohistochemistry Theory and Details for the Mohs Lab

This presentation of the biochemistry of immunohistochemical techniques will include how antibodies work and the development of detection systems. Also included will be detailed description of pH, use of a concentrated antibody, how to properly develop and document a working dilution using a micropipette, and the advantages/disadvantages of concentrated antibodies versus manufacturer ready-to-use antibodies. This is an introduction to a variety of antibodies other than MART-1 and their uses in the Mohs laboratory.

The A to Z of Mohs Procedures: Technical Guidance on Potential Pitfalls

This workshop will focus on discussion and debate of participants' Mohs technical problems, along with suggested remedies. A presentation encompassing common artifacts seen in Mohs laboratories and how best to troubleshoot and avoid these occurring will also be given. CLIA: What You Need to Know

Theory and Procedures for Routine Staining of Mohs Slides

Manual vs. automatic staining procedure will be discussed. Participants are encouraged to bring in stained slides for troubleshooting. This workshop will not include the wet staining of slides.
