

## Workshop Descriptions

### Beginner Tissue Processing

An overview of basic techniques utilized in Mohs tissue processing. Topics covered in this session will include mapping, color coded ink margins, basic relax cuts and scoring, and an overview of different embedding options including the reverse slide mount, heat extractor, cryoembedder, and embedding well/bar (the one represented in this session will be the reverse slide mount method). Embedding instruction for “Whole Mount” and “Bi-Sected/Multi-Sected” specimens, simple wedge specimen and cartilage will also be covered. Presenters will provide technical cryostat information including proper adjustment of the anti-roll plate, brush techniques, and routine troubleshooting tips.

### Organizational Leadership

There are definitive differences between leaders and managers. In this workshop we will explore the primary characteristics of each, define what it means to be a true leader, and discuss the many tools used by leaders to develop credibility and build loyalty.

### Relaxing Tissue and the Slide Method

This workshop will focus on relaxing tissue in preparation for embedding using the Slide Method. A PowerPoint presentation including videos demonstrating relaxing techniques and several variations utilizing the Slide Method will be shown.

### The Basics of Immunohistochemistry on Mohs Sections

A demonstration by the presenter to provide the Mohs tech with a visual of step-by-step IHC staining. This basic introduction will include a discussion of the commonly used antibodies, names and classification of reagents and a recommended staining protocol.

### CLIA: What You Need to Know

This workshop will offer a comprehensive discussion and open forum on CLIA compliance, regulatory requirements for the Mohs laboratory. Bring your procedure manual questions with you to this workshop.

### The A to Z of Mohs Procedures: Technical Guidance on Potential Pitfalls

This workshop will focus on debate and discussion of participants' Mohs technical problems, along with suggested remedies. A presentation encompassing all the steps in Mohs procedures from A to Z and how best to troubleshoot issues that may arise. ### Implementing Procedure and Document Control in the Mohs Lab

Procedure and documentation is critical in running your lab to maintain a safe environment and to assure quality patient care. The first step in preparing for a regulatory inspection is having the necessary laboratory policies and procedures in place. We will cover a methodical approach to creating and implementing policies and procedures in the Mohs lab. Participants will learn how to build a manual to entail technical procedures, Quality Assurance (QA), Quality Management (QM), alternate proficiency assessment, competency assessment, and safety guidelines. We will also discuss electronic document control such as MediaLab and the CLIA/CAP application process. Bring your procedure manual questions with you to this workshop.

### Theory and Procedures for Routine Staining of Mohs Slides

Hematoxylin and Eosin stain is considered the gold standard which has been used for over a century for the clinical diagnosis in the histopathology laboratory. Since this is the most routine stain, we often overlook the problems associated with it. An overview will be given of the chemistry behind the mechanism of hematoxylin and eosin and how to troubleshoot the common problems associated with this stain. Understanding the causes/complaints of the problems and learn how to correct them will be the main topic of this workshop. The pros and cons of manual vs automated H&E staining and the future of routine staining will also be discussed.

### Advanced Tissue Processing

An in-depth overview of advanced techniques utilized in Mohs tissue processing. Topics covered in this session will include “not your average specimen” mapping, color coded ink margins, strategic relax cuts, and scoring of cartilage and wedge specimens, and achieving a quality representative section of adipose tissue (fat). An overview of different embedding options will be given, including the reverse slide mount, heat extractor, cryoembedder, and embedding well/bar (the reverse slide mount method will be represented in this workshop). Embedding instruction will be given for wedge specimens, cartilage, and “Whole Mount” challenging specimens. Presenters will provide technical cryostat information including proper adjustment of the anti-roll plate, brush techniques, and routine troubleshooting tips.

### Troubleshooting Mohs IHC Stains

This is an interactive workshop dedicated to the Mohs tech that executes the IHC staining protocol but the Mohs surgeon sometimes sees different results. This workshop will review the IHC protocol, with emphasis on critical staining steps, provide troubleshooting techniques and recommendations for resolve. Attendees will also be encouraged to share their successes during the workshop.
